PRESERVED & DRIED RULES:

- A. **All entries** in these divisions must be home prepared and canned or packed by the exhibitor within one year of the opening date of the Fair. Specify on entry form the type of product and process (ie., apricot jam, pectin method, boiling-water bath). All products being considered for premium awards, which have not otherwise been eliminated from consideration, will be opened.
 - B. **ENTRIES:** Each entry must consist of one (1) jar. Judged entries can be picked up at the end of the Fair. Each entry must be from a different batch, or the same product preserved by a different method.
 - C. **LABELING:** All entries must be labeled securely on bottom of all jars. Label must include: Exhibitor's name, the product name, the date of preservation, the canning method used, the processing times and temperature or pounds of pressure, and list of ingredients, the Division and Class.

- D. **CONTAINERS:** Standard jars (containers specifically designed for canning purposes) must be used. New tops and screw rings must be used on all jars so designed. Glass-topped containers will be accepted. Fruits, vegetables & pickles may be in 1-pint or quart jars. Jams, jellies, preserves or marmalades may be in 1/2-pint or 1-pint jars. No paraffin seals. All canning must be in sealed jars, unless otherwise stated.
 - E. **RAW UNFLAVORED HONEY:** Should not be heat-processed; state primary flavor.
 - F. **DRIED PRODUCTS:** Must be in jars.

PRESERVED & DRIED RULES CONTINUED:

G. HEALTH REQUIREMENTS FOR PRESERVED FOODS: All non-acid foods & vegetables, including tomatoes & salsa, must be canned under pressure. Low- acidic fruit, such as figs, should be made more acidic by adding lemon juice, as directed in the U.C. Cooperative Extension leaflet, "Home Canning." Fruits may be processed in a boiling-water bath or pressure canned. Relishes: Vegetable relish, including tomato, must be canned under pressure. Fruit relish may be processed in a boiling water bath or pressure canned. Meats: Including jerky, must have recipe attached to entry indicating temperature used to dry meats. USDA research has shown that dried meats must reach a temperature of 165° F to kill bacteria.

Fruits & Vegetables – clear glass, pint, wide-or narrow-mouth jars.

Jellies – clear glass, standard ½-pint jelly jars (sealed lids).

Jams – clear glass, standard ½-pint jars (sealed lids).

TIPS TO PONDER

The difference between Jams, Preserves, Jellies, and Fruit Spreads

- Jams are made with mashed fruits, sugar and they sometimes have added pectin
- Preserves are made with whole fruit or coarse pieces, sugar and usually pectin.
- Fruit Spreads (or spreadable fruit) are 100% fruit with no sugar added, although they usually have added pectin.
- Jellies are made from strained fruit juice, sugar and sometimes pectin. Jellies have a clear, shimmery appearance. Reference – Quick Cooking Magazine
